7. 3 **consanguinity** n. (kŏn s'ăn-gwĭn 'ĭ-tē) (*co, con, col, com* [together with] + *sanguine, sangui* [blood] + *ity, ty* [state of, quality])
The relation of persons by blood, in distinction from affinity or relation by marriage; blood relationship; as, lineal consanguinity; collateral consanguinity.
8. 3 **dentate** adj. (dĕn t'āt) (*dent* [tooth] + *ate* [cause, make])
Toothed; especially, with the teeth projecting straight out, not pointed either forward or backward; as, a dentate leaf. Having teeth or toothlike points. Edged with toothlike projections; toothed.
9. 3 **digital** adj. (dĭj 'ĭ-tl) (*digit* [finger; toe] + *al* [relating to])
adj 1: of a circuit or device that represents magnitudes in digits; "digital computer" 2: displaying numbers rather than scale positions; "digital clock"; "digital readout" 3: relating to or performed with the fingers; "digital examination"
10. 3 **emancipate** verb (ĭ-m'ăn s'e-p'āt) (*em* [embrace/enslave] + *manus* [hand] + *capare* [to take] *mancipare* [to sell, transfer (ownership)] + *ate*[cause, make])
1. to free from bondage, oppression, or restraint; liberate 2. Law. to release (a child) from the control of parents or a guardian.
11. 3 **expedite** v. (ĕk sp 'ĭ-dĭt) (*ex, e, ec, ef* [out] + *ped* [foot] + *ite* [nature of , quality of, mineral product])
To relieve of impediments; to facilitate; to accelerate the process or progress of; to hasten; to quicken; as, to expedite the growth of plants.
12. 3 **incipient** adj. (ĭn-sĭp 'ĕ-ĕnt) (*in, il, im* [into] + *cap, cip, capt, cept* [take] + *i* [filler] + *ent* [thing which])
Beginning to be, or to show itself; commencing; initial; as, the incipient stage of a fever; incipient light of day; only partly in existence; imperfectly formed
13. 3 **mandate** n. (m'ăn d'āt) (*mand, mend* [put in hands of; entrust; order] + *ate* [cause, make])
A formal communication from a reviewing court notifying the court below of its judgment and directing the lower court to act according to; an act by which a person gives another person the power to transact for him or her one or several affairs; an authoritative command : a clear authorization or direction; the authorization to act given by a constituency to its elected representative
14. 3 **manual** adj./n. (m'ăn y'ŏc-ē) (*manu* [hand] + *al* [relating to])

adj. Of or relating to the hands; "manual dexterity"; requiring human effort; "a manual transmission"; doing or requiring physical work; "manual labor"; "manual laborer"; n: a small handbook; a prescribed drill in handling a rifle; keyboard of an organ or harmonium for the fingers, as distinguished from the pedals; a clavier, or set of keys.

15. 3 **multiped** adj./n. (mūl'ē-pēd') also **mul·ti·pede** (-pēd') (*multi* [many] + *i* (filler) *ped* [foot])

adj. Having many feet. n. An animal with many feet.

16. 3 **reception** n. (rē-sēp'shən) (*re* [back, again] + *cap, cip, capt, cept* [take] + *ion, sion, tion* [act of, state of, result of])

The manner in which something is greeted; a formal party of people; quality or fidelity of a received broadcast; the act of receiving; (American football) the act of catching a pass in football; acceptance, as of an opinion or doctrine; a retaking; a recovery.

17. 3 **reincarnation** n. (rē-īn-kār-nā'shən) (*re* [back, again] + *in, il, im* [into] + *carn* [flesh] + *a* [filler] + *tion* [act of, state of, result of])

Embodiment in a new form (especially the reappearance or a person in another form); a second or new birth; the Hindu or Buddhist doctrine that person may be reborn successively into one of five classes of living beings (god or human or animal or hungry ghost or denizen of hell) depending on the person's own actions.

18. 4 **argent** adj./n. (är'jənt) (*argent-* [silver])

adj : lustrous gray; covered with or tinged with the color of silver; "silvery hair"; n : a metal tincture used in heraldry to give a silvery appearance

19. 4 **audible** adj./n. (ō'dē-bəl) (*aud, audit* [hear] + *-able, -ible* [able, can do])

1. Capable of being heard; loud enough to be heard; actually heard; as, an audible voice or whisper. 2. Football. A new or substitute offensive play called by the quarterback or a defensive formation called by a linebacker at the line of scrimmage as an adjustment to the opposing side's formation.

20. 4 **aural** adj. (ōr'əl) (*aur* [ear] + *al* [relating to])

Of or pertaining to hearing or the ear; relating to or characterized by an aura.

21. 4 **aureate** adj. (ōr'ē-īt) (*aur-* [gold] + *e* [filler] + *-ate* [cause, make])

Of a golden color; gilded; inflated and pompous in style; elaborately or excessively ornamented; having the deep slightly brownish color of gold.

22. 4 **detective** adj./n. (dɪˈtɛk tɪv) (*de-* [from, down] + *teg, tect* [cover] + *-ive* [causing, making])
 adj. Of or relating to detectives or their work; suited for or used in detection. n: a police officer who investigates crimes; an investigator engaged or employed in obtaining information not easily available to the public
23. 4 **disgust** n./v. (dɪsˈgʊst) (*dis-, dif-* [apart, away, reverse] + *gust* [taste])
 n : strong feelings of dislike. v: fill with distaste; cause aversion in; offend the moral sense of.
24. 4 **expect** v. (ɪkˈspɛkt) (*ex-, e-, ec-, ef-* [out] + *spec, spic, spect* [look at, examine])
 Regard something as probable or likely; consider obligatory; request and expect; look forward to the probable occurrence of; consider reasonable or due; be pregnant with; look forward to the birth of a child.
25. 4 **ferriferous** adj. (fɛrɪˈfɛrəs) (*ferr-* [iron] + *i* [filler] + *-ferous* [produce])
 Containing or yielding iron.
26. 4 **impalpable** adj. (ɪmˈpæl pəˌbəl) (*il, ir, in, im* [not] + *palp* [feel; touch] + *able ible* [able, can do])
 Incapable of being perceived by the senses especially the sense of touch; imperceptible to the senses or the mind; not perceptible to the touch.
27. 4 **indivisible** adj. (ɪnˈdɪvɪzəˌbəl) (*il, ir, in-, im*[not] + *divid, divis* [separate] + *able, ible* [able, can do])
 Not divisible; incapable of being divided, separated, or broken; not separable into parts; (Math.) Not capable of exact division, as one quantity by another; incommensurable.
28. 4 **ingest** v. (ɪnˈdʒɛst) (*in-, il, im-* [into] + *ger, gest* [bear, carry])
 To take into the body by the mouth for digestion or absorption; o take in and absorb as food; Serve oneself to, or consume regularly; take up mentally.
29. 4 **invisible** adj. (ɪnˈvɪzəˌbəl). (*in* [not] + *vid, vis* [see] + *able, ible* [able, can do])
 Impossible or nearly impossible to see; imperceptible by the eye; not prominent or readily noticeable.
30. 4 **oculist** n. (ɒk yʊˈlɪst) (*ocul* [eye] + *ist* [one who, that which])

A person skilled in testing for defects of vision in order to prescribe corrective glasses; a medical doctor specializing in the treatment of diseases of the eye

31. 4 **tacit** adj. (təˈsɪt) (*tac, tic* [silent] + *it* [filler])

Indicated by necessary connotation though not expressed directly; arising by operation of the law rather than through direct expression; not speaking; silent.

32. 4 **tangible** adj. (ˈtæŋjəbəl) (*tang, ting, tag, tig, tact* [touch] + *able, ible* [able, can do])

Perceptible by the senses especially the sense of touch; possible to be treated as fact; (of especially business assets) having physical substance and intrinsic monetary value; capable of being perceived by the senses or the mind; especially capable of being handled or touched or felt; having substance or material existence; perceptible to the senses.
